ARISC SMALL GRANTS

- ➔ Up to 300 \$ per project
- ➔ Offered since 2020 (first contest announced in fall 2019)
- ➔ Funding: ARISC General Funds and private donations
- ➔ Up to 3 awards will be given for 2024
- ➔ 11 grants awarded since 2019:
 - 2023 – 2 awards
 - 2022 – 5 awards
 - 2021 - 2 awards
 - 2020 - 2 awards
- ➔ Allowable costs include transportation, lodging, meals and incidental expenses, and other expenses needed to support a scholar's research in the South Caucasus
- ➔ **Deadline for current contest: December 8, 2023!**

ELIGIBILITY AND MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

➔ Citizens of Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia

(Proof of citizenship will be requested before giving award)

➔ Bachelor, Master and PhD students [priority will be given to Master's and PhD students]

Applicants should be enrolled in degree-granting programs in Armenia, Azerbaijan, or Georgia. Students graduating in spring 2024 are eligible!

➔ Projects in all fields in the social sciences, humanities, and related sciences are eligible

ELIGIBILITY AND MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

- ➔ Projects should be completed by **July 31, 2024**
- ➔ Grantees are responsible for obtaining the appropriate research permissions. Funding will be conditional until grantees have permission(s) to carry out their research. In general, grantees should seek permission to carry out research directly from the director(s) of the institution(s) where they intend to work, including most libraries housed within local museums. If the material they wish to study is part of an excavation or survey, grantees' funding will be conditional upon submission of a letter that is signed by the project director giving permission to carry out the research. If the study involves living human subjects, and if the applicant's project is selected as a semi-finalist for an award, the applicant will be sent a series of questions regarding the methodology of their project.

TWO GRANT OPTIONS

- OPTION 1 – RESEARCH INCLUDING MOBILITY
- OPTION 2 – REMOTE RESEARCH
 - ➔ how can you address your research question if you cannot travel? what methods, tools, and analyses can you conduct from home or the country where you live?
 - ➔ Access to archives and libraries in the south Caucasus; childcare, so that the fellow may focus on their research during the time period of their fellowship; translation costs; hiring a research assistant in a different south caucasus country to do archival research if the fellow cannot travel; digital research projects, or publication fees for research (publication fees could include website registration/server fees, or open access fees).

SELECTION CRITERIA

- Merits of the proposal for significance, relevance, and potential contribution to regional and/or trans-regional scholarly research;
- Applicant qualifications;
- Research design and methodology;
- Significance to the applicant's field;
- Significance to needs and interests of host country and ARISC's mission;
- Feasibility in terms of resources and amount of time allocated to the project;
- Proficiency in the language required to complete research project, if applicable.

Applications will be read by a panel made up of scholars with experience conducting regional and trans-regional research. Please note that readers may not be specialists in your field, so applicants are advised to write for a general professional audience.

APPLICATION PACKAGE: REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION

- ➔ Application form (pdf file available at ARISC website, must be downloaded)
- ➔ A project statement [i.e. a project proposal] for up to 1500 words (not including bibliographic references, tables, charts, or other supporting information) with cover sheet downloaded from ARISC website
- ➔ Work schedule, i.e. the project timeline
- ➔ Itemized budget in Excel spreadsheet (template available at ARISC website) and budget narrative
- ➔ CV
- ➔ Two letters of recommendation directly sent from recommenders to ARISC (letters should include a cover sheet downloaded from ARISC website)

- What are your qualifications for this project and how will they enable you to do your proposed project?
- Please also identify potential obstacles or issues (for example, geopolitical instability, archive closures, difficulty finding interlocutors, permissions required by local agencies) that may delay your research and how would you meet the challenges of your project should one of these factors be an issue.
- Statement should clearly indicate whether the application is submitted for Option A (travel in the region), or Option B (remote research), with relevant research design and methodology for that option.

Please note that application reviewers may not be specialists in your field. The language of your statement should be clear and free of jargon.

☐ Work Schedule

- Please be specific about the number of days per week and number of hours during the day that you will spend on this research project, as well as the location for this research project. Be sure to verify that the resources you need access to will be available to you.
- Your work schedule should demonstrate that you have checked availability of resources.
- Archives may not be open year-round, and local scholars may be traveling in the summer. Check on availability ahead of time.
- Be aware that it can take up to six months to obtain the necessary in-country research clearance and plan accordingly. We recommend beginning the process early.
- Work schedule should clearly indicate whether the application is submitted for Option A (travel in the region) or Option B (remote research).

PROJECT STATEMENT/PROPOSAL

[UP TO 1500 WORDS]

Evaluation criteria: Proposal should demonstrate significance, relevance, and potential contribution to regional and/or trans-regional scholarly research

- ➔ Describe what you are planning to do; what is your project about; what is your research question
- ➔ Project design & methodology: how are you planning to conduct the project. If you are planning to conduct a field work, explain the details (research methods, number of respondents, etc.).
- ➔ Show the relevance, i.e. why it is so important to conduct this project, demonstrate the need for funding it
- ➔ Talk about your qualifications for this project and how will they enable you to do your proposed project?
- ➔ What are any potential obstacles and how you will handle them?
- ➔ Clear description of either option 1 or option 2 (remote) and respective methodology

WORK SCHEDULE/TIMELINE

➔ Detailed description of the planned activities:

- how many days per month
- how many hours per day.

Example 1:

1. April 2024 – 5 working days, 40 working hours, Tbilisi, Georgia - selection of the politics and IR students from several leading universities in Tbilisi through a call for participants

BUDGET NARRATIVE

Ground transportation - one-way Tbilisi to Svaneti

Taxi from Tbilisi to Svaneti and back is estimated at \$30/ride, totaling \$60

Meals and Incidentals

Travel is estimated at 10 days to Svaneti, at the rate of 15/day, which is within the maximum as set by the State Department, for a total of \$150. I am only requesting \$165 of this cost from ARISC, the remainder will be covered by my department's grant.

Lodging

Typical costs for Airbnb in Svaneti are estimated at \$25/night for 9 nights, totalling \$225. My department grant will cover this amount fully.

Photocopies

The archive charges \$0.25/page to photocopy archival material. I estimate photocopying 100 pages, for a total of \$25.

Conference registration fees

The fee to register for the conference in Svaneti is \$50 per person.

TWO LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

- ➔ The letter of recommendation should include the cover sheet
- ➔ The letters of recommendation (in ENGLISH/translated in English) **must be sent directly from letter recommenders** to info@arisc.org by the application deadline!
- ➔ One of the applicant's letters must be from their academic advisor!

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION SHOULD INCLUDE:

- An assessment of the applicant's project;
- The applicant's ability to carry out the project;
- Assessment of the ability of the applicant to adapt and be resilient while carrying out research in the SC;
- Address the applicant's level of language fluency needed to conduct the proposed research;
- Confirmation of applicant's academic progress;
- Letters should demonstrate that this project and its methodology has been ethically constructed and will not cause harm to participants or the researcher(s).

REPORTING

➔ All project should be finalized by July 31, 2024.

Any unused portion of the stipend must be returned to ARISC by this date.

➔ Narrative report describing the conducted activities – no later than August 31, 2024

➔ Financial report with original receipts – no later than August 31, 2024

➔ Grantees are expected to give an ARISC-sponsored presentation on a subject related to their research upon completion of their project.

➔ The grantee will acknowledge ARISC in any publication or presentation that emerges from the research carried out during the grant.
